1 INTRODUCTION

Harmers acts as agent for the seller of the Goods (Seller) and has been authorised by the Seller to sell the Goods on its behalf. The Goods are sold by public auction, private treaty sale, through www.harmers.com, or by any other means of Harmers.

2 PRECEDENCE

2.1 Harmers will update these Terms from time to time on its website www.harmers.com. If there is any discrepancy between the text of these Terms in an auction catalogue and the Terms published at www.harmers.com, the online version of the Terms will take precedence.

3 RIGHT OF INSPECTION

3.1 prospective buyers are able to examine the Goods to be auctioned during the times publicised by Harmers. The Goods may only be handled with the assistance of Harmers' staff and are handled at the prospective buyer's own risk.

4 BEFORE THE AUCTION

4.1 prospective Buyers are required to pre-register with Harmers before bidding at auction and provide any requested proof of identity documents, or billing information. Registration can be done during any pre-auction viewing days, where applicable. Prospective Buyers can also register for an auction online at www.harmers.com. Harmers reserves the right to ask prospective Buyers for information for identification purposes or regarding bank references as part of the registration process.
